Keeping Our Tamariki Safe

A big thank you to Barb Scott-Hill for coordinating and managing our road patrol team and to our volunteers who help supervise and support them. We also want to acknowledge our road patrol tamariki, who give their time to ensure all our ākonga can cross the pedestrian crossing safely. Lastly, thank you to all whānau who drive safely around our kura; your care and attention make a big difference.

A reminder that during the hours of 8:30 - 9:30am and 2:30 3:30pm, there is a clearway zone on either side of the Victory Crescent pedestrian crossing. This is in place to ensure our road patrollers have a clear line of sight before putting the signs out. We need your support in keeping this area clear during these times. Please do not park in the clearway zones when dropping off or picking up. Cars parked in these areas are reported to the community constable for follow-up. While we would prefer not to have to monitor this, our priority is ensuring all tamariki can cross safely.

We appreciate your cooperation in keeping our kura safe for

everyone.

This week, we have been celebrating all our cultures here at Hampton Hill School. Each day, ākonga have engaged in a variety of activities to explore and appreciate the cultures represented in their classroom. It has been a fantastic week of learning—discovering different traditions, stories, and foods from around the world.

A huge thank you to whanau who joined us to support this week of learning.













Digital Devices in Schools

At Hampton Hill School, digital devices are used as a tool to support learning. IPads are generally used in the younger classes, and Chromebooks for our older tamariki. At school, we are actively putting in place guidance around the amount of screen time that we consider is appropriate for our learners, using the following guidance:

What the <u>Paediatric Society of New Zealand</u> recommends:

There is increasing evidence that managing screen time for students—especially young students—is important for limiting health and safety risks.

When using digital devices for learning at school, the Paediatric Society of New Zealand recommends the time spent on screens is limited by age:

- Children up to 6 should have minimal screen time, in sessions of 10 to 15 minutes.
- Students up to 12 should spend no more than a third of the school day on digital devices, in sessions of a maximum of 20 minutes.
- Students over 12 should have eye breaks every 20 minutes.

They also recommend:

- students use screens in class only with the approval of teachers or kaiako
- a limit on the use of headphones and earbuds
- purposeful and intentional screen use
- a balance between screen learning and outdoor tasks, exercise and play



Parking Reminder

During the busy times of morning drop-off and afternoon pick-up, we kindly ask all whānau to drive with care and consideration. Ensuring the safety of our tamariki as a top priority for us all; it is important to follow the NZ Road Code.

Please remember to also be considerate to our neighbours by not blocking access to their homes. Yellow lines are not parking spots, so please do not stop to drop off.

Zones of Regulation

At Hampton Hill School, we use the Zones of Regulation (ZoRs); an approach used to support the development of self-regulation.

Why We Teach the Zones

Regulation is something everyone continually works on, whether we are aware of it or not. We all encounter trying circumstances that can test our limits. If we can recognise when we are becoming less regulated, we are able to do something about it to manage our feelings and get ourselves to a healthy place. This comes more naturally for some, but for others, it is a skill that needs more attention and practice. This is the goal of 'The Zones of Regulation'; teaching us how to:

- identify our feelings
- be aware of what zone we are in
- start to use tools to be in the appropriate zone for the moment

The Four Zones

Feelings are complicated. They come in different sizes, intensities, and levels of energy that are unique to our brains and bodies. To make them easier to talk about, think about, and regulate, The Zones of Regulation organise our feelings, states of alertness, and energy levels into four coloured Zones – Blue, Green, Yellow, and Red. The simple, common language and visual structure of The Zones of Regulation help make the complex skill of regulation more concrete for learners and those who support them. We learn to regulate our zones to meet our goals and task demands, as well as support our overall well-being, using a mix of sensory supports (or tools), breathing techniques, and thinking strategies.




